

Begin your exploration with the National Museum of Tajikistan before embarking on the Pamir Highway road trip. As you conquer the legendary Pamir Highway, relish the thrill of navigating the second-highest road crossing in the world. Drive along the Abu Darya River, natural border to Afghanistan. Venture further into the Wakhan Valley to explore the enigmatic remnants of Kushan castles, resonating with echoes of ancient civilisations. Experience the cultural mosaic of Murghab in the high-altitude Pamir Plateau, where history and influences converge.

Your journey reaches its zenith at the breathtaking Karakol Lake, framed by the dramatic Pamir Mountains, creating a cross-cultural dimension on the edge of Kyrgyzstan.

The return leg of your adventure takes you back to Dushanbe, passing through Khujand, founded by Alexander as Alexandria Eschate Finally, drive to Tashkent, completing a circuit that transcends time, terrain, and cultural richness. As your road trip concludes, you'll find yourself back in Tashkent, having circled through ancient cities, picturesque landscapes, and the majestic Pamir Highway.

Day 1-2 Tashkent























Day 3-4: Khiva's Living Museum

Day 5 Shirin Etho village



Day 6-7; Bukhara's Timeless Charm

Hop on a high-speed train to Bukhara, where antiquity meets authenticity. Immerse yourself in the ancient city's wonders – from the Lyabi-Hauz complex to the Poikalyan ensemble. Journey to the village of Shirin, experiencing local life at an ethno house. Ride donkeys, savor traditional cuisine, and let the charm of Bukhara weave its spell on you.


Day 8-10: Samarkand's Silk Road Splendours

Day 11: Samarkand - Iskenderkul

Embark on a scenic drive from Samarkand to Iskenderkul. Explore the breathtaking landscapes and cultural richness along the way. Visit key attractions en route to Iskenderkul, ensuring a memorable start to your Tajikistan journey. Dinner and overnight stay in Iskenderkul.

Day 12: Dushanbe



Depart from Dushanbe towards Kalai-Humb, experiencing diverse landscapes and cultural shifts. Enjoy the panoramic views and immerse yourself in the local atmosphere. Dinner and overnight stay at the Karon Palace Hotel 4*.

Day 14 Kalai-Humb - Khorog (260 km, 6/7 hrs)

Continue the journey to Khorog along the Panj River, witnessing the distinct lifestyles on both sides. Explore Khorog's attractions, including the Botanical Garden and Central Park. Dinner at a local restaurant and overnight at a 3-star hotel.











Pamir Highway

Day 15: Khorog - Ishkasim (110 km, 3/4 hrs)

Head to Ishkashim, stopping for hot springs at Garm-e-Chasma. Witness the historical significance of the Wakhan River valley and enjoy the stunning views. Dinner and overnight at Hani

Day 16: Ishkasim - Zong (180 km, 4/5 hrs)

Explore Namadgut village, Bibi Fatima hot spring, and the ruins of Yamchun fortress. Relax in the holy hot spring Bibi Fatimai Zuhro. Dinner and overnight in Zong village at Sash's guest house.

Day 17: Free Day in Zong

Enjoy a leisure day in the wide Vakhan Valley, taking in the historical and natural beauty.

Day 18: Langar - Alichur - Murgab (260 km, 5/6 hrs)


Drive through the scenic Wakhan Valley and potentially experience sleeping in a yurt or homestay. Dinner and overnight stay.

Day 19: Murgab - Karakul Lake (124 km, 3/4 hrs)

Cross the second-highest pass in the world at 4655m. Lunch and dinner at a guesthouse or 2-star hotel.

Day20: Karakul - Bulunkul (360 km, 7/8 hrs)

Drive to Bulunkul village, experiencing the coldest area in Central Asia. Stay at Sulaimon Guest House on the shores of Bulunkul Lake.















Day 21: Bulunkul - Bartang (360 km, 6/7 hrs)

Travel through GBOA to the beautiful Bartang Valley, reaching Khijez village.

Day 22: Bartang Valley - Kalai-khum (300 km, 6/7 hrs)

Day 23: Kalaikhum - Rasht Valley - Dushanbe (310 km, 6/7 hrs)

Pass through Rasht Valley, observing the construction of the largest Hydro Power Station in Central Asia - Roghun. Enjoy dinner in a local restaurant and overnight at a 4-star hotel.

Day 24: Dushanbe

Day 25: Khujand (320km, 6/7 hrs)

Embark on a scenic drive through the Fans Mountains to reach Khujand. Explore the picturesque landscapes and cultural highlights along the way. Dinner and overnight stay in Khujand.

Day 26: Khujand - Border Pass to Uzbekistan - Tashkent

On the final day, cross the border pass to Uzbekistan and return to Tashkent. Reflect on the incredible journey through Central Asia as you head back to Tashkent, marking the end of this memorable adventure. Enjoy a farewell dinner and overnight stay in Tashkent.
